EVACUATION OR SHELTER IN PLACE

- Building offers protection.
- Shelter In Place is best practice - Counter-intuitive does **NOT** mean unsafe.
- Absent evidence of an actual explosive device inside the facility, people are likely safer inside the building. Buildings offer protection from IEDs and Active Shooters.
- Construction and security measures –access controls, door locks, walls, etc. offer protection.
- Uses building for protection as information is gathered.



EVACUATION OR SHELTER IN PLACE

- Allows for the establishment of safe evacuation route.
- Plan for extended time outside the facility.
- Students and staff are accounted for if the threat evolves.
- Must follow the directions of your local police department.



PLANNING AND PREPARATION

- If you have to evacuate, where do we go? Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) site.
- How/When do we inform parents of the situation? SMS, Email, etc.
- How do we ensure accountability of students/staff? SIS systems?
- How do we handle dismissal from a COOP site?
- Define/Assign positions – Law Enforcement lead, Parent liaison, dismissal coordinator.
- Make sure your Emergency Action Plan is up to date. Have a copy ready to go if you must leave your facility.

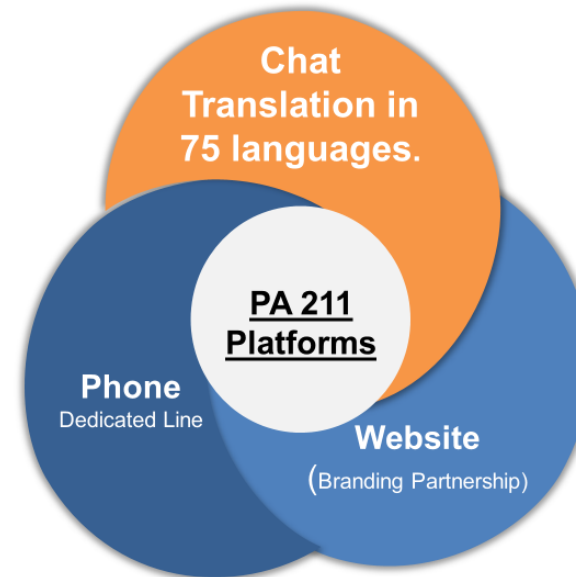

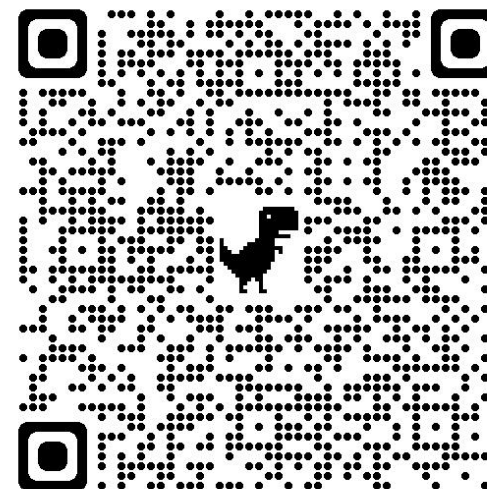
